The beginning of term brought along the introduction of the back to-back sessions and with it, came a new atmosphere within the club. The younger session is 6 - 7:30pm and the older session is 7:30 – 9pm. Staff have changed the lay-out of the room to have a more defined chill-out area along with a craft and discussion area.

Younger Session

Unfortunately the change of times of the younger session has meant that it now clashes with a couple of other clubs in the village, which in turn has resulted in fewer younger people attending the club. However there is still a good weekly average of about 12 young people. In order to increase this, Lisa will carry out an assembly at Melbourn Village College to publicise the club further.

Each week the session will have a specific them which include crafting and cooking activities and often something educational. Along with this the young people also have free time within the centre. The vast majority of young people that attend the session are male and enjoy playing man hunt on The Moor. This allows them to dip in and out of activities within the club and burn off some energy.

Cooking is a positive activity within the club and something they all enjoy. The young people have enjoyed learning to cook new foods and sharing them with the group. It is important to ensure the food cooked within youth club is health or healthy versions of foods they would normally eat at home. Some young people have parental permission to go to the local shop, this has reduced since the sessions have been split and the younger group can partake in cooking.

The young people enjoy partaking in the crafting activities which have included self-reflection mirrors, where the young people decorated mirrors with paint, stickers and objects which reflected their personality. Along with this young people have make figures that demonstrate

a good friend and the qualities they would possess; created doodles for national doodle week and handmade Valentine's Day cards. The young people requested some new games to play within the club, which have proved a great success encouraging the young people to work together and take turns.

Older Session

Without the younger group in the session it has allowed the older group to feel more comfortable and spend their time within the youth club, rather than outside away from the younger group. With this it has brought a good attendance, the older session are able to self-manage which allows staff to engage with the young people allowing for some great discussion; rather than managing the behaviour of the younger young people.

This time period has brought along a variety of discussions about school and family life. The majority of the older group are in year 11 and are planning for their future so discussions are revolving around exams and college. The older group would rather have a chill out session than structured activities, they are however interested in cooking, so it is important to include a cooking activity each week. The young people will take it in turns to cook food for each other, which works well and allows the staff to talk to the young people in smaller groups.

Alongside this there was a session on sexual health which was carried out by the Terence Higgins Trust. The group engaged well with Zoe who carried out the session, which sparked great conversation and educated the young people about safe sex and how to access the c-card scheme. Lisa has asked Zoe to attend the club in the summer term to carry out a session on safe drinking and allow them to use beer goggles which replicates the feeling of being drunk. As it is an important time for the older group it is important not to bombard them with information and allow them a time to relax and socialize with each other.

Volunteers

Although there is not currently a volunteer within the youth club, one has been recruited who will start in April. Nicky will be joining the team with a wide variety of experience within youth work leading Christian youth clubs in Biggleswade, Nicky would like to gain further experience working with young people outside of a Christian setting.

Partnerships and Future work

Liz Williams from A Chain of Wild Flowers Melbourn got in contact with Lisa regarding their annual summer production. Liz wanted to incorporate the young people from the youth club in the event, allowing them a chance to write a poem, a song or carry out a dance in the theme of 'Community Teddy Bears Picnic'. Liz spoke to the young people at within a session about the work A Chain of Wild Flowers carries out in Melbourn and highlighted some successes of last year's production. Liz targeted the younger session as the event falls when the older young people are carrying out their GCSE's. Staff will talk to young people on their return from half term to find out who is interested in taking part in the event.

Lisa will arrange an assembly at Melbourn Village College in the new half term to target the younger age group.

Melbourn Youth Delivery Cost

Staffing £11,264
Session Resources £720
Management, reporting and meetings £2,032

Total cost £14,192 (plus VAT at the prevailing rate)

Timing

Two sessions per week will start in the third week of April 2017 for one year term time only. Sessions will last 1.5 hours each and run back to back. Assemblies in the local school will also take place to promote the project on a termly basis.

Sessions

Groundwork proposes to deliver:

- 36 x 3 hour evening sessions: 1.5 hour sessions back to back from April 2017 March 2018 (term time only)
- Four x Assemblies in school to advertise the youth club one per term.

The price also includes:

- Termly programme planning
- Session planning
- Partnership development
- Attending relevant Parish Council meetings
- · Written progress reports twice during that period
- Project Management fees
- Mileage

Cost breakdown (costs excluding VAT)

Management, reporting and meetings £2,032

Includes set up costs, management of staff for one year, volunteer management

Assemblies £176

• Includes delivery of four assemblies, one each term and planning time.

Evening delivery and session planning time £11,264

• Evening sessions 6-9pm back to back once a week: includes set up and shut down time, session planning time and mileage.

Sessions Resources

£720 is based on £10 per session. This would buy the necessary resources on a weekly basis, things like food ingredients for a cooking session. Larger purchases like sport equipment and craft materials have not been included in this quote, but can be provided on request.

Staffing

Groundwork's Child Protection Policy states that the adult to young person ratio is 1:12. The sessions would be delivered by a lead worker and one sessional worker. We would also

wish to call upon on a pool of volunteers to actively take part in the delivery of sessions and would work with Melbourn Parish Council to recruit the volunteers. Should a member of staff be ill Groundwork would provide appropriate cover.

Programme Content

Groundwork's Youth Club Programmes aim to:

- Deliver high quality support for young people focusing on meeting young people's needs and priorities
- Provide a safe place for young people to go, have something positive to do and have someone to listen too
- Listen to young people so they can influence decisions made at various levels.
- Provide a wide range of personal and social development opportunities.
- Prevent disaffection and social exclusion.
