Many local parishes have already re-opened their play areas, displaying the SCDC signage (which we have) and are making it clear that users access the area at their own risk.

I have prepared a risk assessment and some wording for the website / facebook page advising that the play areas are opening up – attached.

I would like to ask the wardens to clean all equipment next Monday, 13 July with a view to opening next week. To try to ensure social distancing I think it would be helpful to decommission every other swing on both play areas. There will also be signs reminding users to keep their distance.

I spoke to John this morning and I would be grateful if members of the Maintenance Committee would indicate their agreement to the following:

Proposal for the Maintenance Committee:

- 1 To approve the risk assessment for re-opening play areas
- To arrange for the wardens to clean all equipment on The Moor and Clear Crescent play areas.
- Once cleaning has taken place, to re-open both play areas with clear signage relating to safe use of equipment, social distancing and reminding people that they use the play areas at their own risk.
