Attendance requirements	Young people, Leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> No COVID-19 symptoms before meeting (Symptoms as defined on gov.uk). No contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case in the previous two weeks. If more than 2 members are unable to attend because of concern about face-to-face meetings, alternative challenges and/or zoom meetings will continue until Yellow readiness level is achieved. Young people may only attend once the group has written permission from their parent/carer to attend scouting at Amber readiness level. Permission to attend to be recorded via an appropriate field on OSM 1st Orwell has greater than 13 young people in each section. Young people will be given instructions on which day they are to attend face-to-face meetings and asked to 'book in advance' for their place that week. Any young people not booked but trying to attend will be accepted only if there is space after all booked young people have arrived. Whilst waiting, they will have to stay in their cars or greater than 10 m away from the assembly point. They will be notified by telephone if space is available for them. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> If COVID symptoms develop during the meeting, the Young person affected will be asked to sit aside from the activity, supervised by an adult leader standing up wind and with face covering Parents will then be called and asked to take their child home immediately NHS track and trace will be informed. Parents of other young people will be informed upon collection of their young people.
Arrival and Departure Maintaining social distance at drop off and pick up: higher risk of infection spread if social distancing not maintained.	Young people, Leaders, parents/carers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Discourage lift sharing between non-associated households – inform parents Encourage parents to arrive on foot / bicycle with their young people to avoid congestion in the parking area.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All young people and leaders to maintain government specified social distancing from point of exiting transport to assembly position and the reverse at the end of the meeting. • All young people to maintain social distance throughout the meeting. • Arrival via gates in black railings to left of Little Hands Nursery • Departure via wooden gates to right hand side of Little Hands Nursery • Parents and Beavers may exit cars and wait, socially distanced from one another by the black metal railings in the car park area to the left of Little Hands Nursery, using the prominent vertical posts in the black railings as social distancing guides. • Parents will maintain control of their Beavers until they enter the meeting. • Parents are responsible for the social distancing of Beavers until the meeting starts and once, they have their child back. • Beavers will be called into the meeting one at a time and asked to wait at a specific marker on the ground (e.g. Cone) at the assembly point. 1 Beaver per marker. • Markers to be laid out at 2 m intervals • At the end of the meeting, Beavers will be sent back to their parents one at a time and the next Beaver only allowed to leave once the previous Beaver has cleared the area to a safe distance - >5 m • Hands to be sanitised on arrival and departure. • Parents to be informed of arrival and departure routines by email before meetings commence. 	
Maintaining social distance during meeting: higher risk of infection spread if social distancing not maintained. If you have two bubbles meeting at the same time this must be highlighted and controlled in this risk assessment.	Young People Leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Limit our meetings to one group of 15 only • Confirmed with Parish Council that no other official groups are meeting on a Friday evening on the New Rec on The Moor, Melbourn. We cannot avoid the general public being within the space as it is a public area. • Groups to maintain where possible, 10 m distance from other Rec users. • Monitor nationally agreed social distancing throughout activity. • Organise games and activities that do not involve physical contact between people or with common play equipment. • Require long trousers and long-sleeved shirt to be worn at all times. • If play equipment is used, require sanitising of hands before start and at the end. • Regularly disinfect play equipment or leave untouched for >72 hours between uses. • Periodically stop activity for supervised handwashing and disinfection of equipment. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review social distancing requirements before the start of each meeting to ensure we are current. • Review the Scout readiness level at Friday lunch time each week to ensure we are OK to meet
Exposure to droplets from speaking, laughing, coughing and sneezing Risk of spreading infection	Young People Leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Observe social distancing • Encourage coughing or sneezing into elbow • Hands always to be sanitised after coughing or sneezing • Discourage touching of face • Remind young people of requirement to cough and sneeze into elbow at beginning of meeting and throughout meeting

Hygiene of people: higher risk of infection spread if proper hand washing not carried out.	Young people, Leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hand sanitizer to be provided at the assembly point and throughout the meeting, especially when there is no access to running water. • Equipment not to be shared without sanitising with alcohol or detergent based sanitizer. • All young people to bring a named water bottle to meetings and to keep with them at all times. • All young people to bring their own, named hand sanitiser to meetings and to keep with them at all times • All young people encouraged to bring their own face covering if over the age of 11. 	
Welfare provision Drinking water. High risk of infection if shared provision is used and if person providing does follow hygiene	Young people, Leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All members and leaders must bring their own, named container of drinking water. • No drinks will be provided by the unit to avoid the risk of cross contamination. • Young people are not permitted to share drinking water • There is no provision for drinking water on New Rec, The Moor, Melbourn • An unopened 1 litre bottle of drinking water will be held by the leader of each small group along with disposable cups to provide drinking water to young people if they consume all their water or forget their bottles. • Opened bottles must be disposed of at the end of the meeting along with any used cups, which will be bagged and taken home by a leader for disposal in the household waste. 	
Hygiene of toilets: higher risk of infection spread if hygiene not carried out.	Young people, Leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There is no toilet provision on New Rec, The Moor, Melbourn • Young people will be asked to use the toilet before attending meetings • Parents will be made aware of the lack of toilet provision. • Meetings limited to 60 minutes to avoid the requirement for toileting. 	•
Risk from carrying out first aid. Spread of infection	Young people, Leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Where possible depending on the injury a leader, wearing gloves, to remove the items required for the treatment from the first aid kit for the young person to treat themselves under the leader's guidance following social distancing. <p>If a leader is required to provide the first aid, gloves, surgical face masks and a disposable apron to be worn.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Where possible the person being treated to face away from the adult who is treating them, and face coverings to be used where possible depending on the situation for both young person and leader. • First aid kit will include a face shield with valve in case of CPR being required. • Government guidance for first responders recommends chest compressions only for adults, but in children mouth to mouth with compressions is more likely to be required and 	•

The decision as to how to respond will be based on assessing the risks in each specific situation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The first aid kit will contain, Hand sanitizer, Surgical masks, disposable aprons, Gloves, CPR face shield. 1 first aid kit per group of 15 per section. Section leaders to ensure 1st aid kit is properly stocked and all items in date. 	
A member tests positive for COVID and could have been in contact with other members. Spread of COVID to other members and families.	Young people, Leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Record attendance of young people and leaders at each meeting on OSM. Meetings will be turned into 'Events' on OSM and young people invited to attend on their specific weeks. Parents need to accept the invitation to register that their young person will attend the meeting. This will allow us to ensure that we do not have greater than the permitted number of young people attending each meeting. Record attendance of parent helpers in notes section of programme on OSM for each meeting. All attendance records to be kept for 6 weeks. Inform parents that if someone has shown signs of COVID they must inform you. Inform parents their contact details will have to be passed on if required by a statutory body for example NHS track and trace. 	
Meeting on Royston Heath	Young people, Leaders, parents/carers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Special arrival and departure instructions to be sent before that particular meeting. Young people to meet in their small groups as defined before the meeting Scouts – small groups to assemble with 30 minutes separation from one another. Meeting point to be socially distanced behind The Heath café, on the grass field, minimum of 25 m away from the picnic tables. Parents to park in the Heath car park and allow scouts to make their way to the leader in charge. Any communication to be via telephone if required. For collection, parents to wait by their cars and make themselves known to the leader in charge. Scouts to make their own way back to their parent's cars. Each small group to have their own 2 leaders Groups not to mix All other COVID related risks as outlined in this assessment to be applicable (other than arrival and departure). 	
Maintenance of ratios in case of incident	Young people, leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> When meeting, each group must have 3 leaders in attendance; or 2 uniformed leader + sectional assistant or DBS checked parent helper at all times. A 4th DBS checked adult must be present in the vicinity of the meeting, but not participating in the group. This individual will step into the group if a leader has to leave to offer first aid or supervise a young person with COVID symptoms. Any leaders leaving a group to offer first aid (other than for a minor incidence) cannot return to that group for 48 hours. Each group therefore requires 4 adults in attendance, but only 3 to be counted as part of the 15 constituting the group

Meeting in the dark in an open public space	Young people, Leaders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sunset is 17:50 by 23rd October. The Moor is not a lit open space except by the Pavilion. All sections will be affected by the dark by 23rd October • Young people will be required to bring a head torch with them to all meetings. The torch will be worn when doing all activities. • The Moor has rabbits and holes in the turf as a result. All young people to be warned of dangers of rabbit holes. Head torches will make it easier to see the holes. • Portable lighting will be provided by the group in the form of battery lanterns to aid in activities. • Programme to be adjusted to allow for poor light. • Beavers to wear Hi-Vis Jackets at all times. 	
River at far end of New Rec	Young People	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Beavers not permitted to use field past the far end of the pavilion (When viewed from Little Hands Nursery) to avoid them coming close to the river. • Regular head counts to be carried out throughout the meeting by leader in charge • 1 leader to be specifically in charge of 6 Beavers and to count their group at regular intervals throughout the evening.
